I was suddenly surrounded with new possibilities and new ideas and new people--people who saw my inherent worth more than I ever had. They helped change me, helped me to understand that love was a gift--a joy, and that I was more than worthy of it. I began walking my own path, finding my own way. Every time I think that I've finally got this lesson learned, something happens that makes me learn another layer about Love. Finding my best friend was one, finding my partner was another. Finding this church was yet another. This congregation is constantly illustrating how love is safe, how love can help, how love can overcome our differences, and how love will ultimately save us. I hope you'll find a way to experience that love with us this month.



PFLAG to Discuss Those Who Identify as Non-Binary Monday, Jan. 8 6:45 p.m. at Chapel on the Hill

Laura Zepeda will tackle defining nonbinary, and understanding how it relates to individuals who identify as nonbinary, from their own personal experience at the PFLAG meeting on January 8.

The United Church, Chapel-on-the-Hill, will host the meeting in the Activities Room, 85 Kentucky Ave., in Oak Ridge.

All are welcome. The group gathers beginning at 6:45 p.m. for a short social time followed by the presentation starting at 7:00 p.m. The group adjourns at 8 p.m.

Laura, an artist, comedian, and a mental health professional with the Children's Crisis Stabilization Unit in Knoxville, will bring humor as a segue into the topic. They will also explain how to understand, be affirming and comfortable using the preferred pronouns. There will be time for questions.

Oak Ridge has an active PFLAG group which meets monthly, rotating the venue among faith communities including the First Presbyterian, First United Methodist, and Oak Ridge Unitarian Universalist churches, United Church Chapel on the Hill, and the Jewish Congregation of Oak Ridge. PFLAG (formerly known as an acronym for Parents, Families and Friends of Lesbians and Gays) is the United States' largest organization uniting families and allies with people who are lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, or queer (LGBTQ). Its mission is to provide opportunities for dialogue about sexual orientation, gender identities, and to create a society that is healthy and respectful of human diversity.
