Happy New Year!

2023 marks 10 years since I started coming to ORUUC. Before that time, I had not attended church in 20 years. I was so nervous that first day, I needed to sit and cry at my breakfast table to work up the courage to walk through the door.

Upon arriving, I was greeted warmly by a friendly and outgoing woman who introduced herself as Director of Faith Formation. She

told me her name was Tandy Scheffler. She promptly led me down the hall to the

Nursery where I met Susan Rosenbaum. The service included music by Scott Joplin, a tornado drill, and a now somewhat infamous pillow fight during the Story for All Ages. I knew I had found a spiritual home.

As the current Director of Faith Formation, I tear up for entirely different reasons. I had no idea or inclination that this place I walked into would not only be my church, but my chosen profession. I'm sure I would have been too scared or too cynical to believe it. But a decade later, here I am.

Although I treasure this memory, it's one of many memories, joyful and painful, that I have accumulated during my tenure. I had a lot of work to do back then and more so now. In the beginning, I needed to let go of a lot of ideas, prejudices, and hurt feelings to move back into a faith. Now, as a faith leader, I must help guide us into a new and uncertain time.

In reflecting on my time at ORUUC, I have come to appreciate the process of change. Specifically, what change can bring to us in the presence of a loving community. Transformation is mythologized as instantaneous and immediate, the "aha" or Come to Jesus moment. Those are wonderful and inspiring stories. But, transformation is often slow, deliberate, and sometimes painful.

Recently, I came across a saying: Change is inevitable, growth is optional. Transformation, especially when paired with love, creates possibilities for us, but only if we let it. Transformation gives us the unique and precious opportunity to discover our deepest selves and the courage to show that person to the world. It even allows us to become what we have not even imagined yet.

Ten years ago I couldn't foresee myself in this position. Through the process of connecting with the church, taking on new roles, and finding various ministries to serve, I was transformed in ways I couldn't have imagined before. My sense of who I am and even more importantly, who I could become and what I had to offer the world, changed.

ORUUC is filled with many stories of people whose lives were transformed by being a part of this congregation. And this January, we will tell our communal story by constructing a church timeline on January 22nd.

I encourage you to come to this event and share your story and to learn other stories. More importantly, I encourage you to write a new story for yourself at ORUUC: through transformation, through service, and through love.

Thoughts from The Mountain Sarah Gunter, CON advisor

Last month, I had great fun with Brandon White and Robyn Knouff Naughton taking the high schoolers up to "The Mountain" for the fall Mountain Con at The Mountain Learning and Retreat Center along with a huge group of 13 kids.

For those who do not know, The Mountain is a beautiful retreat, center composed of cabins, a large, and housing along with a huge community farm founded by Unitarian Universalists who bought the property originally built in the 30s as a retreat for girls to learn outdoor activities. The Southeast UUs bought the property in 1979 and envisioned as a UU retreat center where UUs from all over could come and be together. The property is on top of Ole Scaly Mountain in Highlands, NC.

The center offers Mountain Cons twice a year for second graders up to senior high and our church has always been a supporter by sending youth groups up there, along with trusted and responsible adults, who advise the kids during the weekend.

They also have family summer camps, farm camp, adventure camp, and even adult summer camp in the summers which fill up quickly.

They are currently looking for young adults to work this summer at the summer camps. They provide housing and pay. The Mountain is also known as a place that features some communal living for those who volunteer a certain amount of hours a week and don't mind living in quite minimal but beautiful surroundings. There will be a need for summer cooks, farmers, and other staff. It's a great opportunity and a way to connect with the wider UU community.
