As Unitarian Universalists, we value our beliefs and do our best to live them. We certainly know them when we see them. However, we often lack the words to explain what they are, I'm no different.

I encounter the same problem when trying to explain what makes a good faith formation leader. Week in and week out, I see leaders who meaningfully engage, care, and guide children and youth in countless ways. Yet, when I try to put into words what

I see, I have a difficult time.

One of the important lessons of Youth Faith Formation is not to be afraid to ask for help. So, as I struggle to put the role of a YFF person into words, I decided to ask them for help.

Here are some responses to "what is the job description of a YFF leader":

Treat each child with respect, interest and love.

Act as an intermediary between inside groups (small group ministries and essential functions) and outside groups (PFLAG).

Manage some energetic kids and foster a positive experience.

Learn to love chaos and learn to tease meaning from emotional experience.

Modeling a respectful and generous pattern of interaction, while trying to keep each youth engaged at the level of their own comfort.

It is our job to teach our children about being in a sacred circle, about respecting ourselves and each other.

The Doorkeeper "protects' the room from "intrusions" into the sacred space of the circle.

Faith is nurtured in many ways and through many leaders. To nurture faith is a process, a complex and sacred interplay of individual development nurtured in relationships. I am as ever humbled by the engagement and dedication shown by our Youth Faith Formation leaders.


What's a favorite ORUUC memory that you have? **Going to the mountain during my senior year.**

What's a favorite ORUUC memory that you have? A favorite ORUUC memory of mine is the pillow fight services at the old church building.


