

### Living into Gratitude

As we move into November this week, the Worship theme becomes "Living into Gratitude." When seeing these words, it's natural and healthy to immediately think of things in your life for which you are grateful. But as we explore "Living with Gratitude", we will also consider what it means to be fully living. Specifically, who brought you into life or brought life into you? And how can your own growth and learning become a source of gratitude for others?

As we begin the month with All Souls Day, we can do this by remembering those who



brought us into life and gave meaning to our lives by sharing mementos of them. For Bread Communion, we are asking folks to think about our shared Appalachian heritage and bring biscuits and cornbread to share. Perhaps there is a special family recipe you and family can make to bring to the congregation.

Remembering and celebrating rituals and traditions deepens our identity and connection to our ancestors. But living in gratitude is in the present tense, it's what we do right now. Living into gratitude means we are in the process of doing. For me this is a challenge to keep moving and finding ways to expand gratitude. This month that might be attending our Word Wise Workshop and updating your vocabulary to support our LGBIQIA siblings. Or maybe it's you and your Youth coming to make Tamales with their

group to put food and holiday spirit on our tables.

Expressing gratitude can feel perfunctory during the month of Thanksgiving, but it doesn't have to be that way. If we view the unfolding of our lives as opportunities for growth and enrichment, then we generate gratitude every day. And for that, we can be thankful.
