Taking Stock

As a child in elementary school, I remember September being represented on the monthly calendar as a red brick school house signifying the beginning of school. It's one of those memories that feels outdated now as in Oak Ridge we are past midterm (also, I never really knew anyone who went to the red-bricked A-line shape school even then).

For me, September now evokes images of change as opposed to beginnings. It usually means a much appreciated change in temperature and colors in leaves. It also means a birthday for me, and with that comes the inner considerations of where I am in my life and deeper questions that arise when examining age-related change. What to leave in? What to leave out?

Fortunately for me and all of us at ORUUC, this September is Fall Rummage. This means all metaphorical sorting can manifest itself into a giant pile at the landing of my staircase.

Every six months or so, our congregation is invited to take stock of the necessities and desires of our individual circumstances and station in life, box them up and take them to church. Once there, they are graciously taken from us and offered to someone else at a deep discount (double on Fridays-I see you, Betsy). The sorting and dropping of my rummage is always cathartic to me. Momentarily at least, someone has relieved me of my burden and I feel free and light.

But the beauty of the Rummage Sale is that taking my things is only the beginning of the experience. Once my personal stuff is offloaded, I can join a team of hardworking and friendly people working to sort, stack and price the variety of things other people have donated. Newly unburdened and refreshed me is welcomed into a community of shared purpose, common goals, and lots of snacks.

The Rummage Sale is a major fundraiser for the church. It's also one of our most important multigenerational events. People of all ages and abilities work together to transform the church into a bargain paradise and then back into a church in a week. That's a logistical feat. It's also a meaningful spiritual endeavor.

Donating to the Rummage sale asks us to look at the things in our lives which may no longer be useful or the right fit anymore and to get rid of it, not just for ourselves, but for the good of others. Working the Rummage sale invites us into community, to labor side by side with people we know well or not at all, for a collective achievement that is greater than what we could do alone. Each of us lets go of small pieces of ourselves to serve and share in a larger, purpose-driven mission. The more people we bring together and the more ways we work together gives us a clearer picture of the Beloved Community. That's faith formation.

Rummage Week begins with Big Rummage Pick Up on Saturday, Sept. 9 and continues through the sale on Saturday, Sept. 16th. Youth who work the sale can earn \$10 an hour up to \$500 towards funding for upcoming trips and activities. Children of all ages can experience the spiritual practices of unloading, stacking, and pricing. Welcome to Worship!
