"I came to the United States as a political refugee in 1995 at the age of 21, and as most immigrants, I felt that you are not given an opportunity like this one to waste it. So, I learned the


language, the culture, the system; I worked and studied hard (two master degrees and various certifications.) I did everything by the book, but I

> was left burnt out, griefstricken, and traumatized, because the current systems are like a machinery that inflicts tremendous harm to our nervous systems. The trauma I experienced under systems of oppression (and the journey through the underworld that followed)

opened my eyes to human suffering in a completely different way.

My experience with trauma and oppression shapes my current Ministry of Heart & Soul."
