

April Split the Plate Offering: The Child Advocacy Center of Anderson County

Every Sunday we share our offering 50/50 with a local agency chosen by our members during a vote at the Congregational Meeting each June. This month, the recipient is the Child Advocacy of Anderson County.

The mission of this organization is "Healing and Justice for Abused Children". It serves approximately 400-500 children annually. At the center, staff provide forensic interviews, forensic medicals, trauma focused - cognitive behavioral therapy, and other victim services including education and advocacy. CAC coordinates the



Anderson County Child Protective Investigative Team and are trained in diversity, inclusion, and equity for all clients. ORUUC's support of the Child Advocacy Center has helped many children heal and recover from traumatic abuse, thus supporting the dignity and worth of each child served. NEW! Board Corner

Each month, the ORUUC Board of Trustees will have a section of *The Exponent* to highlight recent Board action to help keep ORUUC informed. We are beginning with the first major action taken this past year, an ORUUC Gun Policy, along with the history and circumstances surrounding this decision.

First some history:

- Before July 2021, in Tennessee you needed to have a permit to carry a handgun, whether concealed or open carry. This permit required, among other items, an 8 hour gun safety course and a background check.
- Beginning In July 2021, Tennessee moved to allow open or concealed carry with no permit required. The only requirements to have a handgun in public are:
 - The subject is 21 or older (18+ if active military service or honorably discharged);
 - The subject is in lawful possession of the handgun; and
 - The subject is in a place where they are lawfully present.

In July 2023, the Safety Team requested permission to post "No Open Carry" signs for the September 2023 rummage sale. A Taskforce, made up of two people each from the Board, Safety Team, and Executive Team, met to research our options (including the requested "No Open Carry" signs, a complete gun ban, or continue to have no policy at all), and ultimately approved the use of "Concealed Carry by Permit Only" signs for the September rummage sale. The "Concealed Carry by Permit Only" sign not only requires a person to have a permit to conceal carry, but also forbids open carry of any handgun.

After the rummage sale, the Safety Team requested that the signs be posted permanently, but more research and stakeholder input was needed before the Board could make such a decision. The Taskforce held three town hall meetings in October and November (two in person and one virtual) to allow input from all stakeholders, and provided a summary of all discussions to the Board. The board shaped policy based on the feedback provided by the congregation.

A policy was approved by the ORUCC Board of Trustees in Nov 2023 which effectively provided the church with the same legal protections regarding the open carry of



firearms as was present in Tennessee before July 2021.

The complete text of the policy is "Signage specifying ORUUC firearm policy will be posted at all main entrances. This display must include signage described by Tennessee law which states, 'Concealed Carry By Permit Only', and includes all required text, formatting, and graphics. Accompanying each legal notice, additional signage will be posted that clearly reads, 'NO OPEN CARRY'".

The Taskforce and Board are continuing to tackle other safety issues while working on the creation of a Comprehensive Safety Policy for the church.

Lastly, on the first Sunday of each month, a member of the Board will be available after worship to talk about issues of concern, answer questions, or help clarify recent actions. This Sunday, April 7, you may find Kara Raymond in the Social Hall.


UUA GENERAL ASSEMBLY VIRTUAL GA · JUNE 20 - 23, 2024



PFLAG meets Monday, April 8 at Chapel on the Hill to talk about Mental Health

Toni Stephenson, Co-Chairperson of the Oak Ridge affiliate of NAMI (National Alliance on Mental Illness) will speak at the next PFLAG meeting on April 8. The United Church, Chapel on the Hill, will host the meeting in the Activities Room, 85 Kentucky Ave., Oak Ridge.

All are welcome. The group gathers beginning at 6:45 p.m. for a short social time followed by the presentation starting at 7. The group adjourns at 8 p.m.

The presentation will cover the basics of what NAMI, the nation's largest grass-roots mental health organization, offers in general. The talk will also focus on what is now available for the LGBTQ+ community. Although a nontraditional sexuality is not a mental illness, because of stigma and misinformation many experience difficulties in their mental well-being. Participants will also be asked what additional things NAMI can do for them. Questions and feedback will be welcomed.

PFLAG (formerly known as an acronym for Parents, Families and Friends of Lesbians and Gays) is the United States' largest organization uniting families and allies with people who are lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, or queer (LGBTQ). Its mission is to provide opportunities for dialogue about sexual orientation, gender identities, and to create a society that is healthy and respectful of human diversity.

Oak Ridge has an active PFLAG group which meets monthly, rotating the venue among faith communities including the First Presbyterian, First United Methodist, and Oak Ridge Unitarian Universalist Churches, United Church Chapel on the Hill, and the Jewish Congregation of Oak Ridge.
