### Where's My Nuclear Powered Jet Pack? Reflections on the newness of the new year

It's been 2023 for almost two weeks now, and surely you're well on your way to accomplishing the goals you pondered, especially those things you put off till after the holidays. Right? RIGHT? Well... me neither. And it reminds me of a common internet whine, when are we getting those nuclear-powered jet packs that scientists have been

talking about for decades now?
As Dean Burnett says in The
Guardian, "After all, we've
invented jets, we've invented
backpacks, what's the problem?"

If your hopes have been high about jetpacks, or maybe those six-pack abs you were going to get at the gym by now, your expectations may be in need of a reset. I submit as an example this photo of the paperwhite bulbs I planted right about Christmas.

As you can see, four of the five bulbs are now tall and glorious, reaching high with aspiration. They've formed buds – one ambitious sprout has two! But then there's the little one in front. It hasn't grown much, and though it's still green, it's leaned over.

I planted the paperwhites as I often do, to brighten the January gloom, but

I can never resist thinking of them as symbols of my own new year's goals. That makes it disappointing to see one of them so far from reaching its potential. On the other hand, having one just not taking off is more apt symbolism than if they'd all been spectacular performers.

Have you already had some early

failures in the new year? I have (and not just in the flowerpot). Some things that help me manage my feelings about fizzles and fiascos are 1) to acknowledge my disappointment, 2) to remember that perfection was not the goal (or not a realistic one), 3) to assess

what went wrong, and 4) to be really, really gentle with myself.

I promise not to let my disappointment about the little gnarled bulb get in the way of the glory that is promised by the others as they begin to bloom. And I promise not to whine about all the advances scientists were supposed to produce (nuclear-powered jetpacks, an end to Covid), and maybe re-set my expectations by sorting out science from science fiction (nuclear-powered jetpacks, an end to Covid).

# This Sunday, Jan. 15 The Meek and the Mighty



# Volunteer with Ecumenical Storehouse by Michael Bjerke

The Ecumenical Storehouse is a non-profit organization administered by a group of 12 local churches, ORUUC included. Its purpose is to collect used furniture and other household items and distribute them, at no charge, to families in need. Approximately 300 individuals receive our help each year, and we are hoping to expand our outreach. Families are referred to us by either a social service agency, like ADFAC, or by local churches. This makes sure that the service is available to those who are most in need.

There are many ways that you can help with this very necessary service. First, Storehouse volunteers pick up furniture and other items from donors every Saturday from 9:00 till noon. Our church is responsible for coordinating volunteers on the third Saturday of every month. Martin Bauer is usually the lead on this, but this month's point of contact is Hal Hoyt, who can be reached at halhoyt@hotmail.com.



There is no training required for this job, just a willingness to help! The items we pick up range from heavy furniture to lightweight, such as linens, lamps, and pots and pans, so don't think you have to be able to lift a sofa to help. Our next pickup day is Saturday, January 21.

Items are distributed from the Storehouse to needy families every Tuesday and Thursday from 10:00 to noon. Each church in the group, or several churches working together, handle a full month of duties, which include answering the phone, helping people choose items, and helping them load up their vehicles.

**ORUUC's next month to handle this is March**, and we do it together with Chapel on the Hill. As with pick up duties, most requires little training (answering phones is the exception).



#### New Member Welcome!




ORUUC welcomes Leslie Shapard as a new member! Leslie shared a bit about herself recently.


