## **Cultivating Community During Snowmageddon**

To "cultivate" means to prepare something, as for planting, and growth. Sometimes it means expanding capacities, and it often implies a kind of nurturing of the newly created thing, too.

I know that a lot of thought went into developing the ORUUC mission statement, whose first word <u>and only verb</u> is "cultivate."

What is the church cultivating, when it's at its best (i.e. when it's living out its mission)? "A

community," by which I believe you mean both a church community and its

surrounding location, too. And what kind of community are we cultivating? One that is "alive with justice and joy!"

So just to paraphrase, here you are preparing yourselves and Oak Ridge for expanding your capacities and nurturing the bonds you've created among yourselves and your neighbors, so that all can live with equity and pride.

And along comes... SNOWMAGEDDON.

Plenty of churches would have hunkered down and canceled all activities. But at ORUUC, you responded differently: You cranked up the energy and stepped up the leadership (thanks, Christina Elliott and Amanda Branche). You found some natural partners to help with the execution of this bold plan. You opened up the building and stocked it with warm blankets and coats and food. And in a very short amount of time, you opened up an emergency shelter to care for our unhoused neighbors in this town.

Have we learned some lessons in the execution of this loving embrace of our neighbors? You bet we have.

> But there will be time for debriefing later. Right now, folks are busy making sure people are safe and warm and fed. Church

members have been generous with time and food and money and air mattresses and blankets and on and on. Thanks to everyone who helped in any way.

A mission statement is just a set of words on a piece of paper.

Sometimes church members can't even recite their own mission statements, which can be fine IF the church stays engaged actually living out its mission. ORUUC, hat tip to all of you for your support of this week's immense effort to cultivate a community alive with justice and joy!

# January Split the Plate Offering: YAIPak Outreach (Tornado Relief in Middle and West Tennessee) wit

Every Sunday we share our offering 50/50 with a local agency chosen by our members during a vote at the Congregational Meeting each June. Each year, members chose nine organizations, leaving three months open for emergency needs. The Executive Team recently voted to direct the January Split the Plate offering to Tornado Relief in Middle and West Tennessee, specifically YAIPak Outreach. Named for their motto, "You Are Important," YAIPak Outreach is a non-profit local to the Clarksville region that, in normal times, operates a free household "shopping" warehouse, works



with unhoused people and those transitioning to housing, provides new foster children with clothing and school supplies, and more. Since the tornado outbreak in December, their volunteers have been on the ground serving area residents. As needs have shifted from chainsaws, work gloves, and generators to clothes, household items, toiletries, and space heaters, YAIPak has kept pace with the day to day needs of survivors in the area. We here at ORUUC can help the residents of Middle Tennessee recover from this devastating storm by supporting YAIPak's work. You can learn more at

Last year, Ecumenical Storehouse volunteers picked up and distributed an estimated \$180,000 worth of used furniture, household goods, and appliances to 316 families in need. The families helped consisted of 437 children and 482 adults. Families served live in Anderson, Roane, Morgan, Campbell, and Scott counties. 



## Margarete Ohnesarge April 18, 1934 - January 9, 2024



Margarete Ohnesorge, age 89, of Oak Ridge, passed away on Tuesday, January 9, 2024, at Commonwealth Senior Living, attended by her daughter. Margarete was a member of Oak Ridge Unitarian Universalist Church.

She was born Margarete Kirchner on April 18, 1934, to the late Gerhard Kirchner and Erna Vogt, in Bremen, Germany. In 1950, she moved to California at the age of sixteen. Once living in the States, Margarete preferred to be considered American. In 1962, she moved to Oak Ridge with her husband, Jim Ford. There she had her first child, Jimmy, who passed away in 1968 from leukemia.

Margarete was an avid photographer who joined the Carbide Camera Club in 1975. After 23 years of marriage, Jim passed away at age 50 in 1984.

Margarete then went back to school to qualify as a Health Physics Technician and found work at Oak Ridge National Laboratory in bioassay.

Margarete met Walter Ohnesorge at ORNL, and they married in 1991. They were kindred spirits who loved being outdoors as much as possible. After Walt retired, they traveled and went hiking more than ever. Margarete's photography captured their wonderful experiences together until Walt passed away in 2013.

Margarete was preceded in death by son, Jimmy Ford; first husband, Jim Ford; second husband, Walter Ohnesorge; sister, Erika; and brother, Peter. Survivors include children, Susan Ford and Kenneth Ford, both of Tennessee, and sister, Heide, of Australia.


