

However your life is going in this time of transition, I hope you'll feel comfortable bringing your struggles



January Split the Plate Offering: Tornado Relief in Middle and West Tennessee

Every Sunday we share our offering 50/50 with a local agency chosen by our members during a vote at the Congregational Meeting each June. Each year, members chose nine organizations, leaving three months open for emergency needs. The Executive Team recently voted to direct the January Split the Plate offering to Tornado Relief in Middle and West Tennessee, specifically YAIPak Outreach's Tornado Relief, This organization was chosen by the Unitarian Universalist Fellowship of Clarksville Board to be the recipient of its relief donations.



YAIPak's work includes a "shopping" warehouse (similar to Ecumenical), outreach to unhoused persons, support for children entering foster care, collection of household items for persons transitioning to housing, and relief response to natural disasters. They are currently active in the Clarksville area's tornado relief distributing household items, food, toiletries, shoes, heaters, holiday items, etc. If you'd like to learn more, visit

PFLAG to Discuss Those Who Identify as Non-Binary Monday, Jan. 8 at 6:45 p.m. Chapel on the Hill

Laura Zepeda will tackle defining nonbinary, and understanding how it relates to individuals who identify as nonbinary, from their own personal experience at the PFLAG meeting on January 8.

The United Church, Chapel-on-the-Hill, will host the meeting in the Activities Room, 85 Kentucky Ave., in Oak Ridge. All are welcome. The group gathers beginning at 6:45 p.m. for a short social time followed by the presentation starting at 7:00 p.m. The group adjourns at 8 p.m.

Laura, an artist, comedian, and a mental health professional with the Children's Crisis Stabilization Unit in Knoxville, will bring humor as a segue into the topic. They will also explain how to understand, be affirming and comfortable using the preferred pronouns. There will be time for questions.

Oak Ridge has an active PFLAG group which meets monthly, rotating the venue among faith communities including the First Presbyterian, First United Methodist, and Oak Ridge Unitarian Universalist churches, United Church Chapel on the Hill, and the Jewish Congregation of Oak Ridge. PFLAG (formerly known as an acronym for Parents, Families and Friends of Lesbians and Gays) is the United States' largest organization uniting families and allies with people who are lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, or queer (LGBTQ). Its mission is to provide opportunities for dialogue about sexual orientation, gender identities, and to create a society that is healthy and respectful of human diversity. 





Thank You, ORUUC, from Ecumenical Storehouse



During 2023, ORUUC members and friends donated \$3,062 to Ecumenical Storehouse through two months of Split the Plate offerings.

Eccumenical Storehouse sent a thank you letter with a some year-end stats:

- In 2023, Ecumenical Storehouse volunteers picked up and distributed an estimated \$180,000 worth of used furniture, household goods, and appliances to 316 families in need. The families we helped consisted of 437 children and 482 adults. Families served live in Anderson, Roane, Morgan, Campbell, and Scott counties.
- Volunteers worked an esimated 3,150 hours to serve clients and pick up used furniture.
- For every \$1 spent on our operations, we were able to distribute an estimated \$4 worth of furniture, household goods, and appliances.



Lift Every Voice and Sing by James Weldon Johnson


