ORUUC Members and Friends of all ages have been making origami cranes to honor Shigeko Uppuluri, who died last month at the age of 92. Steven Albright is creating a beautiful display in the sanctuary for Shigeko's Memorial Service, scheduled for Saturday, Aug. 5 at 2 p.m. More cranes are still needed—the hope is to have more than 1,000 paper cranes take flight!

Ministerial Search Update – July 2023

Christy White, Ministerial Search Committee Member

As the summer settles over us like a warm, steamy blanket; the ministerial search committee has begun meeting. Our two gatherings thus far have been very informal, with lots of snacks and ice-breaker questions, mostly geared toward settling into the task before us and learning how we will work best together.

One sentiment we've all shared is the great honor each of us feels at being called to serve ORUUC in this way. Each of us arrived at the decision with thoughtfulness and take very seriously the the opportunity to do the hard labor necessary to accurately reflect the will and wishes of the congregation.

One thing we noticed is that the ministerial search timeline that has been shared thus far gets a little murky after the congregation votes on the committee. To that end, we thought we'd share more of a timeline of what search will look like (and what to look out for), including date estimates.

Roughly, the search is conducted in seven general phases. We've already finished phase one (The Good Goodbye) and phase two (electing the search committee), so pat yourselves on the back for a job well done!

The next big lift is phase 3, "Building the Structure to Search." Major elements of this phase include:

- Facilitated by representatives from the UUA, we will make a search covenant and take a deep dive into the roles and tasks necessary for our work on behalf of the congregation.
- September-ish A congregational survey: Thoughtfully crafted by the UUA Transitions Team and regional staff, this survey will be made available to every member of the church and includes questions that emphasize what the congregation needs from a new minister.
- November-ish Cottage meetings/focus groups: Smaller group gatherings, these meetings are an invitation to participate in group conversations to hear and build on what others say about ORUUC.

Phase 4 and beyond will start in winter of 2023, and there's plenty to keep us busy in the meantime (check out page 9 for more information).

Until next time, we appreciate your trust and support of us all as we embark on this grand adventure.

All Oak Ridge and Anderson County elementary schools are participating. On Fridays throughout the school year, a backpack of healthy, easilyprepared food is provided to children who may be missing meals on a regular basis.



Currently, 13,571 children at 286 schools receive backpacks. It costs \$100 per year to sponsor one child. (This includes all costs, not just food.) 

The City of Oak Ridge Honors Shigeko Uppuluri

From the City of Oak Ridge: The Oak Ridge City Council honored Shigeko Uppuluri, who passed away last month at the age of 92, for her contributions to the Oak Ridge community and the world at their July 10 meeting.

"No one embodies a commitment to a culture of peace, love and understanding more than Shigeko Uppuluri, and she will be remembered for her unassuming nature, her peaceful spirit, her patience, her excitement about trying something new, and her expression of love, friendliness and joy, often conveyed through a smile or a giggle," the proclamation said. Shigeko Uppuluri lived her early years with her family in Shanghai, Tokyo, and Kyoto, and in the late 1950s, received a scholarship for graduate work at the University of Indiana, where she met her husband, Ram Uppuluri, a native of India.

Since she came to Oak Ridge in 1963, Shigeko has been an ambassador and mentor to countless Oak Ridgers as well as to Japanese and other international visitors; and whereas, this quiet dynamo influenced international understanding through her work with such diverse organizations as the Girl Scouts, the Children's Museum, Oak Ridge schools, the League of Women Voters and Women's Interfaith Dialog, and, understanding the challenges of life in another country, Shigeko was instrumental in establishing a program at the

YWCA to welcome and mentor families from other countries by helping with language, doctor's visits, shopping, or children in school.

At Oak Ridge National Laboratory, Shigeko served as a translator and teacher of language and culture to scientists traveling to Japan, and, as Tennessee became host to Japanese companies establishing auto-related businesses, she extended her mentoring and outreach to helping these guests adapt to their new home.

When the 50th Anniversary of Oak Ridge was planned in 1992, Shigeko and Ram proposed their idea for the International Friendship Bell to commemorate the event and chose the theme "Born of war, living for peace, growing through science." They, along with Oak Ridge scientists, led successful efforts to raise funds locally and in Japan, and arranged for the Bell to be cast by a Master Bellmaker in Kyoto and transported to the United States by the Honda company.





The Free Medical Clinic will be providing annual sports and schools physicals, and required vaccinations for all students at the NAACP-Anderson County Back to School Fair Saturday, July 22 at 1 p.m. at the Scarboro Community Center Gymnasium, 148 Carver Avenue, Oak Ridge.

Special thanks to the East Tennessee Foundation for their funding support for this historic free medical event with our underserved communities. FMC, along with valued community partners: The City of Oak Ridge, NAACP, Hero Health, Oak Ridge Schools, and Anderson County Schools, will provide back to school and medical help to struggling families. FMC will enable students who can't afford a sports physical to receive free care so they can sign up with their school or community teams. FMC will also provide free annual school physicals and required vaccinations.



Oak Ridge Schools proudly presents an exciting free community event in conjunction with premiere week for the acclaimed blockbuster film, Oppenheimer. The event will be held at the Oak Ridge High School Auditorium on Wednesday, July 19, from 6-8:30. 
