### Let's Sit at the Welcome Table

### This Sunday: Bread Communion

Out of necessity, and out of generosity, we get...cornbread. Indigenous peoples like the Cherokee in our region had cultivated corn for a thousand years before Europeans arrived. As they had for generations, the Cherokee lasted through the lean months, in part, by grinding their dried corn and baking it into griddlecakes and bread. Natives shared their corn and their customs with the newcomers to help them survive the winter. Europeans, in turn, shared corn in Africa, where it quickly became a staple, easily preserved and thus good for enduring hard times.

In the mountains of East
Tennessee, many generations of
Cherokee, African American, and
white Appalachian folks shared
the practice of drying corn and
wheat and using them to make

simple "batter breads" like cornbread, johnnycake, and biscuits. The practice brought together diverse cultures, and helped them survive hard times.

This year's annual Bread

Communion at ORUUC will celebrate our diverse heritage by offering the simple breads of our region to sustain our spirits and our community. We'll gather up a bounty of cornbread and biscuits (contact Christine Rehder <a href="mailto:crehder@oruuc.org">crehder@oruuc.org</a> to be part of the baking

team) and share them together in love, to celebrate our abundant heritage, and strengthen our community.

Each year, 400-500 children ranging in age from newborns through age 17 receive forensic medical evaluations. trauma focused therapy, forensic interviews, and other victim-related services. The CAC is a safe haven for children, who are provided services to help them heal and recover from childhood abuse and neglect. Support is also offered to non-offending parents and caregivers.



## Church Hike TOMORROW at Big Ridge State Park





## Volunteer at the Oak Ridge Playhouse!


