Chop Down the Giving Tree

In January 2017, among all of the protests that were being held as Donald Trump was inaugurated president, there was one called The Giving Tree Program. One of the voices lifted up in this protest was from a now-retired UU minister in Colorado who was expressing his concern over climate change. Using the principles of grassroots activism, people were

urged to send president-elect Trump a copy of Shel Silverstein's book The Giving Tree, which is about a boy who knows no limits in what he asks from a tree. The gesture was meant to encourage our government to preserve and build on environmental safeguards, including the Paris Climate Agreement. Well, how did that work out for those who participated in the Giving Tree

protest?

I'll tell you this Sunday, in my sermon about that very book. It's a children's book that was written over 50 years ago, and it has been – more than most

children's books – a focus of controversy. The Giving Tree can be interpreted in different ways, and can be seen as a morality tale for our times. You might be interested in seeing how it can be viewed as an ecological fable that ends

badly for both humanity and the planet.

As Unitarian Universalists, our Seventh Principle calls on us to work together in a spirit of generosity, in order to preserve the earth for future generations. For us, perhaps, The Giving Tree story warns us about what will happen if we don't.






