Change Is On the Horizon

Most Unitarian Universalists are familiar with our Seven Principles. We have them on walls, bulletins, wallet cards, websites, and more. Few UUs know that "the principles" come directly from the bylaws of the Unitarian Universalist Association (UUA).

In more than six decades since the founding of the UUA, much has changed in American society, in American churches, and in Unitarian Universalism. And the principles have changed along with the times. The last revision was in 1987.

Since early in the 21st century there have been many projects, resolutions, task forces and other strategies calling for a review of the principles. Does the language, primarily from 1961 with a worthy edit in 1987, still capture who we are as a religious community? Do the principles serve to tell the larger community who UUs are, and do they call current UUs to grow into our higher selves?

In 2021, the UUA board empowered a study commission to look at the principles. Since they're found in Article II of the UUA bylaws, it was called "the Article II Study Commission." The A2SC was broad and diverse (our neighbor and thoughtful UU in Maryville TN, Rob Spirko, was a member). They held many discussions in

various forums, and some ORUUCians participated.

I imagined that the A2SC would craft less staid language, and an 8th principle would be added. I was surprised to see that the A2SC came up with something strikingly new, and strikingly different.

Here's what the proposal says: Love is our common theological core, and everything we do is rooted, as we say at ORUUC, in love. Love is behind and below and woven throughout our lives.

And a list of principles and sources, no matter how beloved, can't really capture that reality.

So, last year at General Assembly (GA) the delegates to study this new proposal for a year. We were not asked to adopt the new proposal,

but simply to study it.

I hope you'll accept the invitation of the A2SC and the delegates to GA to engage in this deep work. Take a look at the graphic (on page 3), and spend some time with it before you react. Look at the UUA materials. Of course there will be sermons and discussion groups at ORUUC, too. As society and churches face a magnitude of change that we haven't seen for centuries, perhaps we can meet the dawning age with fresh eyes and new relevance. May it be so!

Today at ORUUC we continue our dive into our heritage by exploring what it means to be a church bound by a covenant. The Split-the-Plate


