One of the things I love most about ORUUC is the ways we show up for the wider community. From Stone Soup celebrating 13 years of free monthly meals, and the sweet smell of oranges drifting through the social hall after Fresh Fruit for Kids distributed hundreds to area schools, to speaking out in support of LBGTQ+ affirming literature at library board meetings, ORUUCians strive to effect positive change in the area day after day. What would happen, then, if we took a weekend off?

It's one of the principles of selfcare that you cannot pour from an empty cup, that you must fill your own glass too in order to serve others. The annual all-church retreat is our opportunity to do just that. As a community, we step back from the demands of everyday life, gathering together in the timeless spiritual practice of retreat.

This year's retreat will be held October 13-15 at Harrison Bay State Park. We start off on Friday evening by settling into our open-air cabins and sharing dinner together. Puzzles and games are brought into the common area, which I often end up thinking of as the "social hall" of the event. Past evening activities have also included stargazing, bonfires, and storytelling, to name a few. Saturday is our chance to take advantage of the park's amenities together, including hikes of varying difficulty, paddle boarding, or simply relaxing in a hammock. This year, Saturday morning offers a special treat: a little over half of an annular solar eclipse will be visible from our location!

Saturday afternoon, puzzles and games continue, more hikes and outings are available, and there's usually outdoor games. The evening usually finishes up



with an informal coffeehouse and gathering around the firepit. Have an idea of something you'd like to do? Let us know on the registration form!

Sunday morning, everyone pitches in to "leave no trace" before finishing the weekend with a brief and often impromptu worship service.

Our 7th principle tells us that we are all part of an interconnected web of existence. The retreat allows us ORUUCians to experience new and different parts of that web of existence together as a community, breaking bread together, exploring new trails, and worshiping together under the open sky. I look forward to joining you there!

This Sunday, Oct. 1 How to Live A Life of Courage, and Compassion

We kick off our month-long celebration of Heritage by telling the story of one of our ancestors. She was a girl in the 1820s who liked to ride fast horses and play baseball, and she was often the smartest kid in the room. Long before "public health nurse" was a thing, this young and courageous woman worked as a healer and educator and went on to have an international platform to advocate for compassionate responses to public health crises. Universalist Clara Barton started nursing the sick at ten years of age and worked at the American Red Cross (which she founded) until she was eighty-three. We'll bring Clara to life at this multigenerational service. A potluck follows, so bring some food to share!


